- 1. What did you like best about this book?

- 5. Which characters did you like least?
- 6. Did you have any favorite quotes from the book? Why did this quote stand out to you?
- 7. If you got the chance to ask the author of this book one question, what would it be?
- 8. Which character in the book would you most like to meet?
- 9. What do you think of the book's cover? How well does it convey what the book is about? If the book has been published with different covers, which one do you like best?
- 10. How original and unique was this book?
- 11. If you could hear this same story from another person's point of view, who would you choose?
- 12. Do you think this story would make a good graphic novel?
- 13. Did this book seem realistic?
- 14. How well do you think the author built the world in the book?

- 15. Did the characters seem believable to you? Did they remind you of anyone?
- 16. Did the book's pace seem too fast/too slow/just right?

#### MY QUESTIONS FROM THE BOOK:

- 1. What does Leo feel when she realizes she can do magic?
  - a. What are the consequences of her breaking the rules?
  - b. Why does she keep doing it?
  - c. What would you have done differently?
  - d. What kind of situation would it have been ok to break the rules?
- 2. The story's setting and plot relied on Latino/Mexican religion and folklore. How was this the same or different than other stories you've read about witches or magic?
- 3. Leo is the baby of the family, and her desire to 'prove' herself as being ready to be a grown up gets her into trouble. How would the story have been different if she were a different age or birth order?
- 4. How were Marisol and Isabel different? How were they the same? How did their differences move the story forward?
- 5. Caroline has doubts about their plan regarding Brent. At one point when the spell goes wrong, she says Leo should tell her Mom or Isabel; they need help.

Leo doesn't' despite Caroline being unhappy about what's happening.

- a. What do you think about that?
- b. What should Caroline have done differently?
- c. Was she 'right' to stay quiet and let her friend handle it or should she have told an adult?

#### 1. The Haunted House Project (Clasen, Tricia):

#### 2. The Girl Who Drank the Moon (Barnhill, Kelly Regan):
