Activity Ideas – Shape and Size Toddlers

Block Play. Simple wooden or plastic blocks are a great way to introduce young children to basic shapes. A good knowledge of shapes will help them when the time comes to recognize and write letters.

Shape Sizing. Cut out shapes in different sizes and let your child play with them. Ask them to be put in order smallest to largest, or mixed together so that no two of the same shapes are next to each other. These two-dimensional shapes are different from the three-dimensional blocks which will encourage a different kind of play.

Biggest Thing. After reading the book *I'm the Biggest Thing in the Ocean,* start noticing the biggest things around you. A tree in the park, a bus at an intersection, the tallest fence in the neighborhood. Talking about these things will help your toddler become aware of his/her surroundings and help build vocabulary.

The Shape of Things

What is a circle? What is round? A quarter rolling on the ground. A shell is a circle so is the moon, A bottle cap or a big balloon.

What is a square, with sides the same? The wooden board for a checker game. A slice of cheese, a slice of bread, The book that you and Mom just read.

What is a rectangle, straight and tall? The door that stands within your wall. A dollar bill, a loaf of bread, The mattress lying on your bed.

What is a triangle, with sides of three? A piece of pie for you and me. A musical triangle, ding, ding, ding, A slice of pizza with everything.

These are the shapes seen everywhere: A triangle, rectangle, circle, square. If you look closely where you've been, You'll surely see the shapes you're in!
